# Equinox Research

## Preparing for BIBFRAME in Public Libraries

The King County Library System Foundation provided funding for a limited research project partnership between Equinox and the King County Public Library System (KCLS) centered on public libraries and Linked Data (LD) with an emphasis on the new Bibliographic Framework (BIBFRAME) model. The project began in September 2024 and culminated in a two-day onsite workshop in Issaquah, WA in April 2025. Through this partnership opportunity, Equinox worked with KCLS to facilitate research centering on cataloging needs at the intersection of library cataloging, metadata management, and library IT.

The project's concentration on public libraries was designed to address an unmet need for representation as public libraries are often dependent upon aging technologies while data models and expectations rapidly evolve without their active participation. During the last fourteen years of moving BIBFRAME forward within the library industry as an alternative to the MARC format, public libraries have had minimal involvement in its development or evaluation. This poses a challenge because BIBFRAME is now at the point where public libraries must prepare for working with BIBFRAME or risk having the long-term future of public library metadata be decided elsewhere.

With the support and guidance of Information Technology Services (ITS) Director, BJ Colvin, KCLS project participants included team members from both the Collection Management Services (CMS) and ITS departments. The Equinox project leads, Galen Charlton, Implementation and IT Manager, and Jennifer Weston, Product and Education Manager, facilitated the various components of the project along parallel paths to emphasize both cataloging and technology perspectives.

The project was completed in three phases led by the Equinox team: (1) Linked Data Orientation Webinar and baseline participant survey to evaluate awareness of LD in libraries; (2) Provision of metadata editor tools and evaluation of editor functionality with the BIBFRAME structure; and (3) Onsite workshop hosted by KCLS for all participants. Workshop discussions included a review of BIBFRAME as a content standard focused on future usability and the needs of the communities of users served by public libraries.

The project's findings offer a public library perspective on the possibilities and challenges of adopting a model like BIBFRAME and provide groundwork for expanding the conversation. Future planning recommendations from the project call for an emphasis on a continued push for public library inclusion in BIBFRAME to build a pathway for a staff-friendly infrastructure and strategic exploration of potential positive benefits for public library users.

Representing the research partnership, BJ Colvin, Galen Charlton, and Jennifer Weston made presentations on the project and its findings at multiple national and international conferences in 2025 including the [2025 Evergreen International Conference](#), the [ALA 2025 Annual Conference](#), and the [2025 BIBFRAME Workshop in Europe](#). Equinox would like to thank the King County Library Foundation for funding this important project and for being a great partner and champion of public libraries.

# Equinox

## *Open Source Grant*

**At Computers in Libraries 2025 Equinox staff member, Felicia Beaudry, presented, “Community Engagement, Service Innovation, and Transformation,” on the impact of the Equinox Open Source Grant on March 25, 2025.**

Launched in 2019, the Equinox Open Source Grant provides Koha ILS to eligible organizations that are unable to obtain or maintain an ILS because of financial and technological needs. Preference was given to libraries serving underrepresented and marginalized communities. The grant offers implementation, hosting, and support services to recipients for three years. Grants may be renewed for libraries that demonstrate an ongoing need.

Equinox conducted two rounds of grant awards in 2019 and 2020. Past grantees included:

- » Biblioteca Nacional de Puerto Rico (San Juan, Puerto Rico)
- » Center for Khmer Studies (New York, NY)
- » Spark Central (Spokane, WA)
- » Vermont Jazz Center (Brattleboro, VT)
- » Weeksville Heritage Center (Brooklyn, NY)

As part of the renewal process, Equinox gathered detailed narratives describing the impact of the grant. These reports documented some results that might be expected from the addition of a modern ILS such as increased circulation of collections and improved and simplified collection management. However, what stood out the most was the expansion of new services and community engagement activities all made possible by freeing up staff time and resources previously dedicated to maintaining access to the library's holdings.

### **Biblioteca Nacional de Puerto Rico**

Biblioteca Nacional de Puerto Rico, the National Library of Puerto Rico (BNPR) is part of the Institute of Puerto Rican Culture, with a mission to research, preserve, promote, and disseminate Puerto Rican culture in all its diversity and complexity. Its collection is composed of materials authored and published by Puerto Ricans.

As a result of receiving the grant, the National Library was able to make parts of their holdings searchable to users worldwide for the first time. They were also able to maintain availability to parts of the collection when the library was forced to temporarily close due to electrical problems.

The National Library also leveraged the success of the grant to obtain additional funding to begin work on the first Digital Library of Puerto Rico. The Digital Library will include digitized content from five of the most important libraries in the country: the National Library, Library of the Supreme Court of Puerto Rico, Library of the Ateneo Puertorriqueno, the Puerto Rican Collection of the Library from the Medical Sciences Campus of the University of Puerto Rico, and the Puerto Rican Newspaper Library and Collection from the University of Puerto Rico, Rio Piedras.

It is the first member institution of the Council of American Overseas Research Centers in Southeast Asia. CKS promotes research, teaching, and public service pertaining to the social sciences, arts, and humanities in Cambodia and the Mekong region.

The Equinox Open Source Grant provides Koha ILS for CKS's library in Siem Reap, Cambodia, the largest publicly accessible library in Cambodia outside of Phnom Penh. Prior to receiving the grant and the implementation of Koha, the library experienced almost daily ILS outages because of local network instability. Patrons were often unable to utilize library resources, and staff were forced to spend much of their time troubleshooting the problem. Access to Koha on Equinox's U.S.-based hosting platform has eliminated this issue, allowing for 24-hour availability to library resources and freeing staff to focus on public service and programming.

The grant allowed CKS to expand its collection to more than 27,000 items, welcome 12,000 visitors, 3,350 of them children, and reach 111,000 users online. New initiatives included CKS's first-ever book fair, drawing 5,000 attendees, and library capacity-building training for institutions including the National Museum of Cambodia, the Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum, and the Preah Norodom Sihanouk-Angkor Museum.

## Spark Central

Started in 2016 in Spokane, Washington, Spark Central's mission is to make participation in extracurricular programming equitable by removing common barriers: cost, access, and confidence. Spark Central provides internet availability, technology, curriculum kits, and programming for children and adults. Its collection highlights local artists and authors.

Before the Equinox Open Source grant, Spark Central relied on a legacy ILS that did not support its unique operational needs or provide insights into the user of its services. Through the grant, Spark Central barcoded its collection, implemented more efficient cataloging practices, and automated patron notices. Reporting capability with Koha's robust analytics enabled staff to assess whether programs, such as their Level Up youth program, were reaching their intended audiences. Koha allows time to be shifted away from manual tasks and allows for increased focus on community outreach and program development.

## Weeksville Heritage Center

Weeksville was one of the largest free Black communities in pre-Civil War America. Weeksville Heritage Center exists to preserve this historic site and its accomplishments through oral histories, museum and archaeological collections, and archival and bibliographic materials.

Before receiving the grant, the Weeksville Heritage Center did not have an ILS, leaving staff unable to catalog its materials, rendering them inaccessible to the public, and making it difficult for librarians to find materials to assist researchers and visitors. The grant supported the Weeksville Heritage Center's reference services, educational programs, and more.

## Vermont Jazz Center

Founded as a non-profit in 1997, the Vermont Jazz Center (VJC) grew from the shared vision of jazz guitarist Attila Zoller and pianist Eugene Uman, along with collaborators Elsa Borrero and Howard Brofsky. Together, they imagined a welcoming space where musicians could learn through concerts, workshops, weekly jam sessions, jazz history classes, ensembles, and private lessons. Today, the Center's mission is to create, promote, and preserve jazz for artists, students, and the broader community through performance and education.

The VJC's unique collection was largely uncataloged because its legacy ILS could not meet its needs. Since receiving the grant, VJC has successfully cataloged a majority of its holdings, partially through the work of interns from Amherst College and the State of Vermont's Vocational Rehabilitation Program. Interns gained valuable experience and exposure to significant cultural and educational resources.

Future plans include the enhancement of access to VJC's video archive. The Center will be collaborating with other institutions, including the Center for Black Music Research at Columbia College and Worcester Polytech, which are digitally preserving the archive content and metadata while also helping to promote the collection.



Koha ILS is a leading open source integrated library system. Its flexibility, cost-effectiveness, and active supporting community make it a sustainable choice for libraries of all sizes, ensuring reliable access to essential tools and continual innovation. Equinox provides hosting and support, migration services, training, and software development for Koha.

Equinox implemented Koha ILS and Aspen Discovery for Estacado Library Information Network (ELIN), a consortium of five libraries in southeastern New Mexico, including four public libraries and one community college library.

Equinox also completed the implementation of Koha ILS for the first cohort of member libraries from the Private Academic Library Network of Indiana (PALNI). PALNI supports private colleges, universities, and seminary libraries across Indiana. Rollout for additional cohorts is planned for 2026 and beyond.

Equinox participated in the [Koha-US 2025 Annual Conference](#), hosted in Providence, Rhode Island. Koha-US is a membership organization that brings together the community of developers and libraries that utilize the internationally popular ILS in the northern hemisphere. The theme for this year's conference was, "All That and More," and it was held from September 2, 2025 through September 5, 2025.

Galen Charlton, Implementation and IT Manager, co-presented with Brian Pichman of ByWater Solutions on managing the impact of AI bot and crawler traffic on Koha web-based library catalogs. Tools such as the open source firewall utility, Anubis, and services like Cloudflare were highlighted as ways to help Koha libraries keep their catalogs accessible to the public despite pressure from bot and crawler traffic.


Aspen Discovery is a fully featured, open source discovery system with a single search box and smart results that are formatted to be user-friendly. Aspen Discovery also provides tools for promoting collections in a variety of methods beyond traditional searches, which help patrons more easily discover all the resources available through their local library.

Respondents to the 2025 Library Perceptions Survey from Library Technology Guides, ranked the usability of Aspen Discovery highest when supported by Equinox. Equinox's configuration and customization of the system to a client's specific needs, along with comprehensive and customized training resources, allow library staff to use the system and assist patrons with confidence. Equinox implemented Aspen Discovery for two of its largest consortium clients in 2025: the Missouri Evergreen Consortium and the Pennsylvania Integrated Library System. Each consortium selected pilot libraries to be the first to offer Aspen Discovery to their communities, with additional members planned for rollout in 2026 and beyond.

Equinox contributed Aspen Discovery presentations at the 2025 Evergreen International Conference, Code4LibSE/ Devops4LibSE, and AspenCon 2025. Topics included structuring training for Aspen Discovery, navigating implementation, and building a branded Aspen Discovery app with LiDA.

VuFind® is an open source discovery toolkit that allows libraries to replace their traditional public catalogs and make their collections more visible and user-friendly. It brings together books, digital resources, and institutional materials in a single search platform, giving patrons intuitive tools to explore, discover, and access resources with ease.

In 2025, Equinox completed a consulting and IT services project for the [Historical Society of Pennsylvania \(HSP\)](https://www.hsp.org/). Equinox worked with HSP to update their two VuFind® systems: Discover ([https://discover.hsp.org](https://discover.hsp.org/)) and Encounters ([https://encounters.hsp.org](https://encounters.hsp.org/)). These systems bring together metadata from their library catalog, encoded archival description records from Archivists' Toolkit, records from the Orphan Society of Philadelphia, and digital records from the HSP Digital Library and the Philadelphia Record Photograph Morgue. Equinox worked with HSP and the University of Pennsylvania staff to establish a data feed to retrieve records from the catalog and make them visible in VuFind®. Equinox also upgraded HSP's Discover system from VuFind® 5 to version 9.1.

Equinox also implemented VuFind® for the National Center for Atmospheric Research (NSF NCAR), an organization dedicated to providing resources to Earth system science researchers. It is managed by the University Corporation for Atmospheric Research and sponsored by the National Science Foundation. VuFind® allows NCAR to unify searching of their library catalog, archives, digital collections, and e-journal holdings in one search interface.

Equinox continues to serve the VuFind® community as a Registered Service Provider. Registered Service Providers for VuFind® support knowledge sharing, demonstrate expertise in open source technologies for libraries, and contribute to the financial sustainability of the VuFind® project. Equinox was the first Registered Service Provider for VuFind® in the United States, and has been active in that capacity since 2022.
